



Sunfire Corporation Product Purchase Agreement

SALES AUTHORIZATION: The DEALER is authorized to sell, or to offer Sunfire products for sale, to end-user consumers only. Dealer shall not transship – that is, sell or transfer in any way – any Sunfire products to any person or entity **for resale** without the prior written approval of SUNFIRE.

INTERNET, MAIL ORDER, CATALOG, AND TELEPHONE SALES: The DEALER shall refrain from any internet, mail order, catalog or telephone sales of Sunfire products.

The DEALER and STOCKING REP further agree:

1. The sale of Sunfire products involves custom installation - - including on-site delivery, installation and service by Dealer's personnel;
2. Dealer will not solicit orders from customers through the Internet, a website, or similar communications;
3. Dealer advertisements in nationally distributed publications (or electronic media) must refrain from mentioning the Sunfire brand, or must clearly indicate that **Sunfire products are not available for purchase through mail order, the internet, catalogs, or telephone sales;**
4. In accordance with applicable state laws, Sunfire products will be delivered in unused, unblemished condition, with serial number and product manual intact. (see California Penal Code excerpt below, as an example of code found in each state);
5. In the case of sales which do not adhere to these policies, Dealer will lose access to all Sunfire Products, and Sunfire will pursue both civil and criminal legal action against Dealer for fraud, misuse of intellectual property, etc., to the full extent that the law allows.

537e. (a) Any person who knowingly buys, sells, receives, disposes of, conceals, or has in his or her possession any personal property from which the manufacturer's **serial number**, identification **number**, electronic **serial number**, or any other distinguishing **number** or identification mark has been removed, defaced, covered, **altered**, or destroyed, is guilty of a public offense, punishable as follows:

(1) If the value of the property does not exceed four hundred dollars (\$400), by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding six months.

(2) If the value of the property exceeds four hundred dollars (\$400), by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year.

(3) If the property is an integrated computer chip or panel of a value of four hundred dollars (\$400) or more, by imprisonment in the state prison for 16 months, or 2 or 3 years or by imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one year.

For purposes of this subdivision, "personal property" includes, but is not limited to, the following:

(1) Any television, radio, recorder, phonograph, telephone, piano, or any other musical instrument or sound equipment...

(6) Any bicycle, exercise equipment, or any other entertainment or recreational equipment.

(7) Any electrical or mechanical equipment, contrivance, material, or piece of apparatus or equipment.
